# Proverbs 5 [KJV]

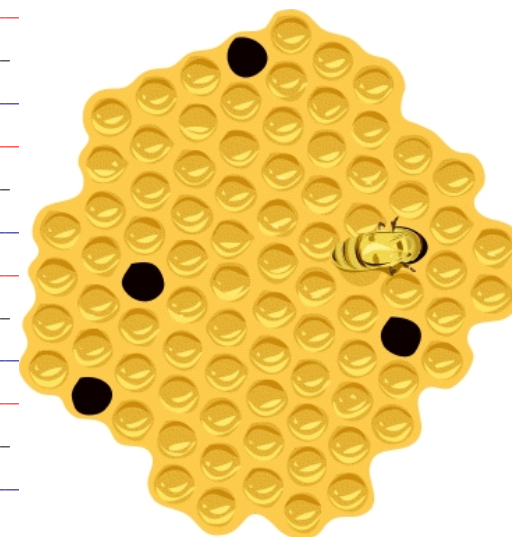
- 1 My son, attend unto my wisdom, and bow thine ear to my understanding:

- 23 He shall die without instruction; and in the greatness of his folly he shall go astray.



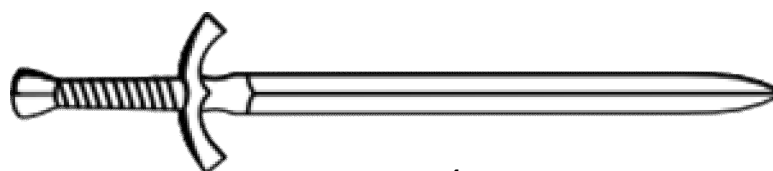

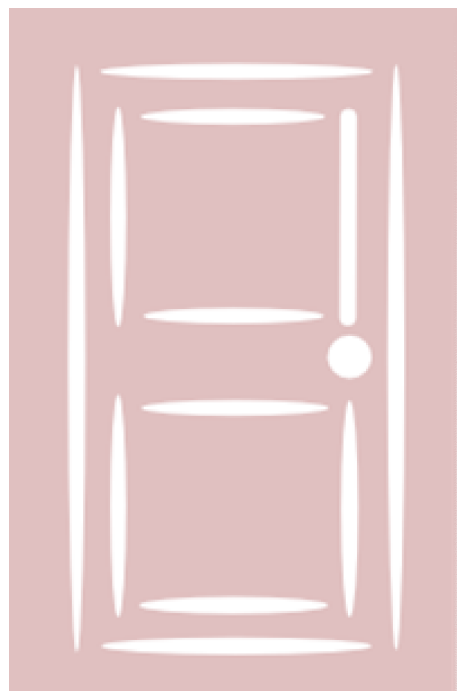

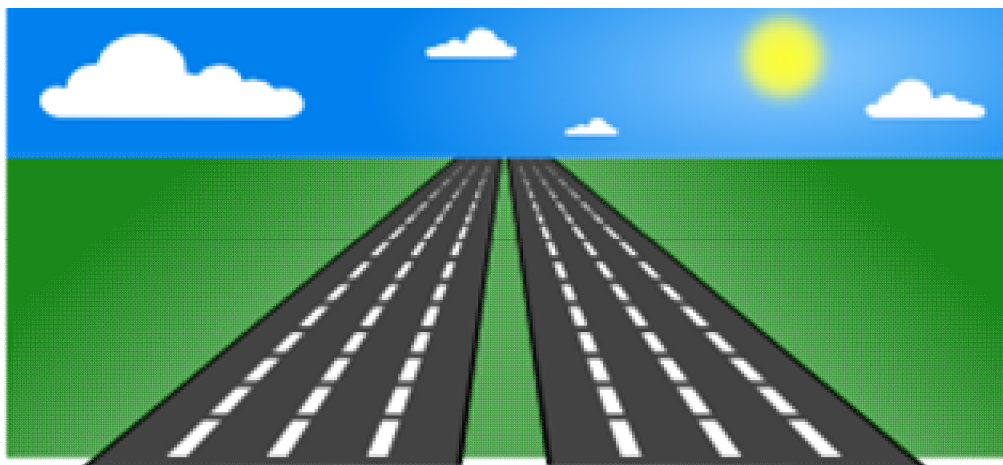
